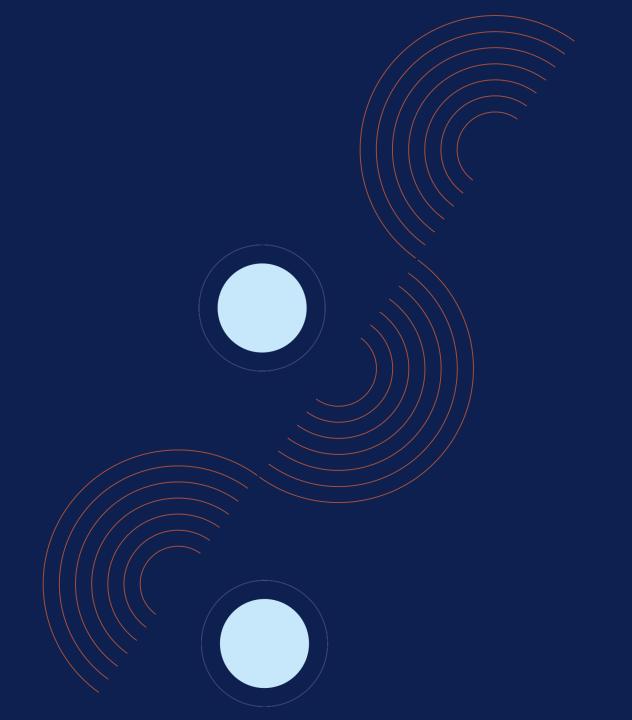

Overall commitments were up significantly at A\$176m compared to A\$104m for the same prior year period

Total capital invested increased from A\$68m to A\$95m

Dividend

LCM declares a dividend of 2.25p per share for the full year ended 30 June 2023

Share buy-back

Company also announces that it intends to commence a A\$10 million share buyback programme over the next 12 months, returning value to shareholders

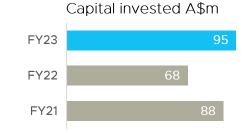

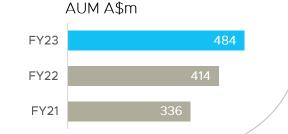

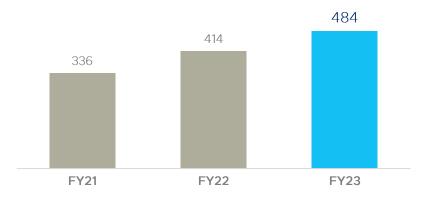

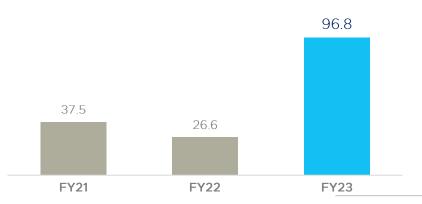

FY23 Financial position overview and consolidated AuM – exclusive of third-party fund (\$A)

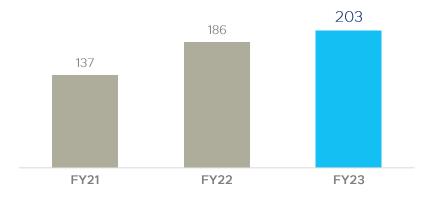
Assets Under Management(\$m)*



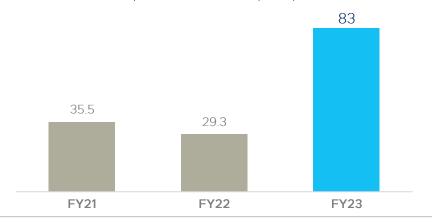
Cash generation¹ (\$m)

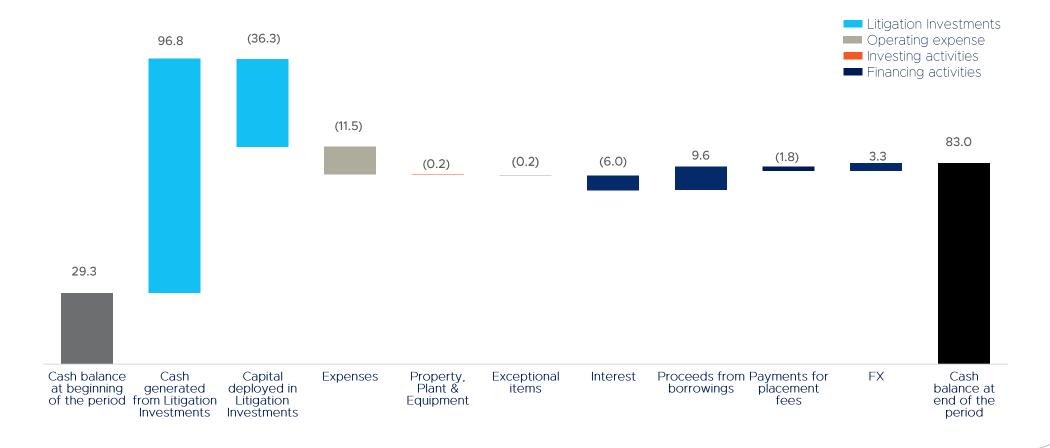

exclusive of third-party fund (\$A)





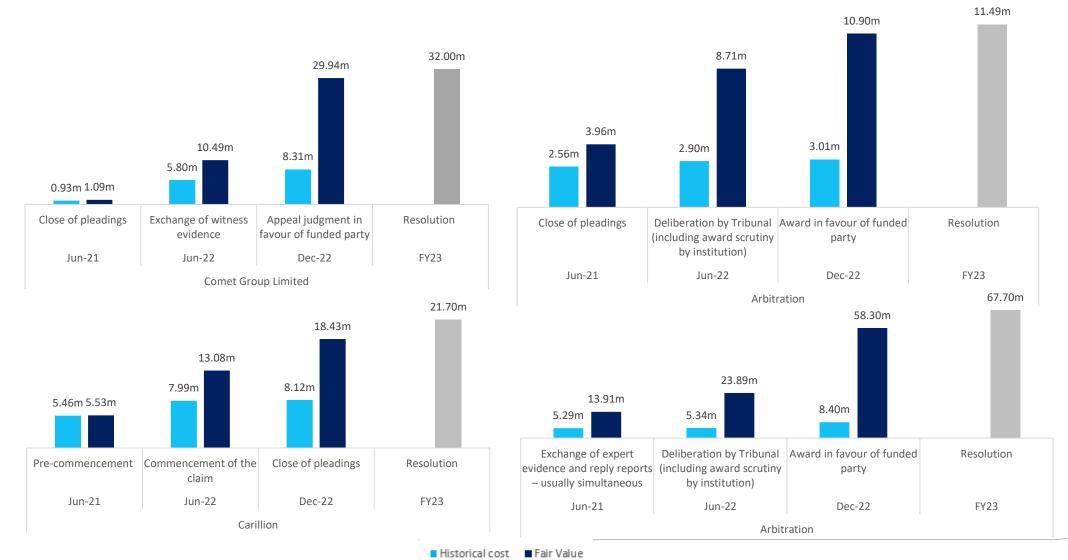
Transition to Fair Value accounting

- In consultation with our advisors LCM is adopting a valuation methodology which allows us to value each investment to determine its fair value at the relevant point in the financial period consistent with industry peers
- Transition to Fair Value accounting will provide transparency and greater visibility with respect to the underlying progress and value of our portfolio of investments
- Value will build over the life of an investment as the matter progresses through the court or arbitral system and as observable milestones are achieved
- Discounted Cash Flow ("DCF") approach applied to each underlying investment
- We have drawn upon 25 years experience in the litigation finance industry, over 250 completed investments, together with the data collected during that period. We subjected that valuation framework to extensive back testing against our track record to date to ensure accuracy
- Our investment process and underwriting procedures with respect to investment selection has not changed

Favourable market conditions



Uncorrelated returns

Each and every investment whether the subject of a direct investment or as part of the fund portfolio is uncorrelated to each other



Countercyclical business

Global financial markets are experiencing high volatility. Historically dispute levels rise during periods of instability and the level of insolvency events increase. Corporates tend to look for alternative ways of financing their disputes spend



Low market penetration

Despite demand for litigation finance steadily increasing, the levels of market penetration in the various markets in which LCM operates is very low



Demand expanding rapidly

The demand for litigation finance is steadily growing from year to year



Market consolidation

In a number of the territories in which we operate, we are seeing consolidation which is having the effect of reduced competition



Shifting legal market dynamics

The expectations of corporates are changing. Clients increasingly expect law firms to be flexible and offer alternate solutions to disputes fees, creating an opportunity for LCM

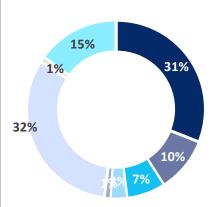

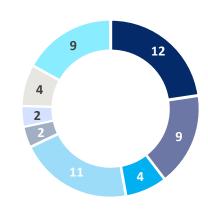

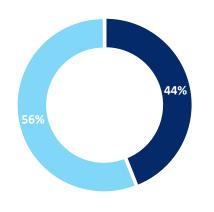
Portfolio by industry sector

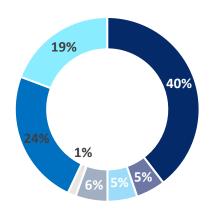

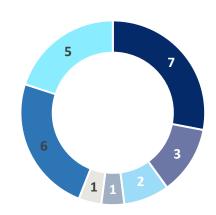

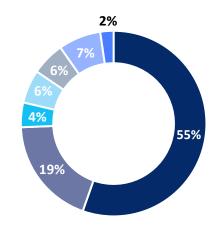

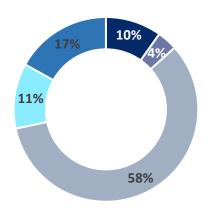

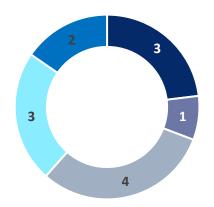

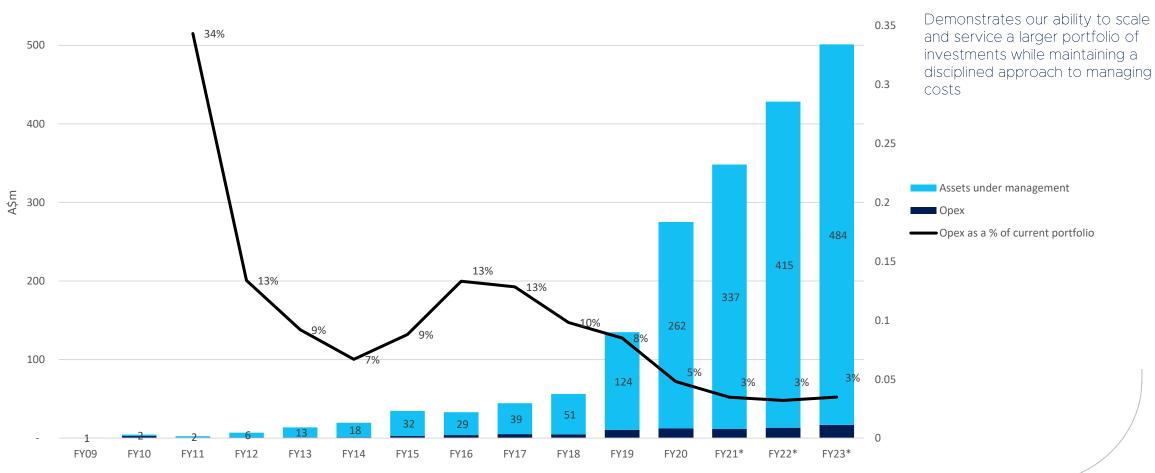
- In line with the structure of Fund I, we strive to build an overall portfolio which is diversified through industry sector, claim type and jurisdiction as well as avoiding concentration risk

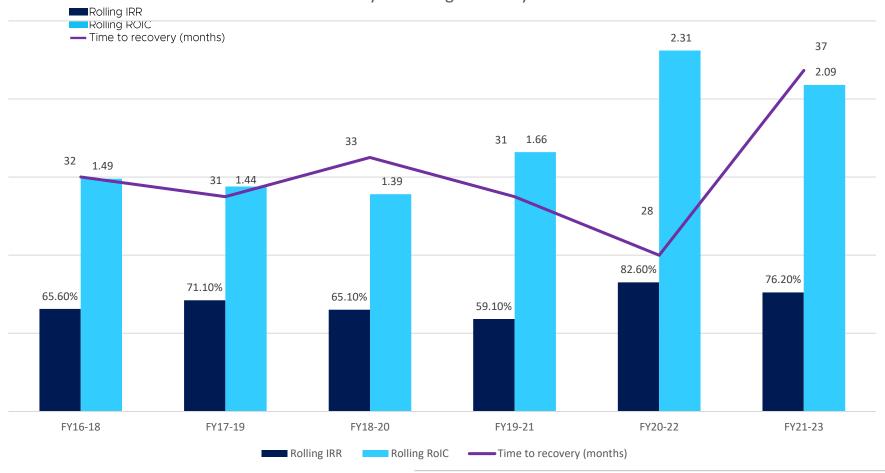

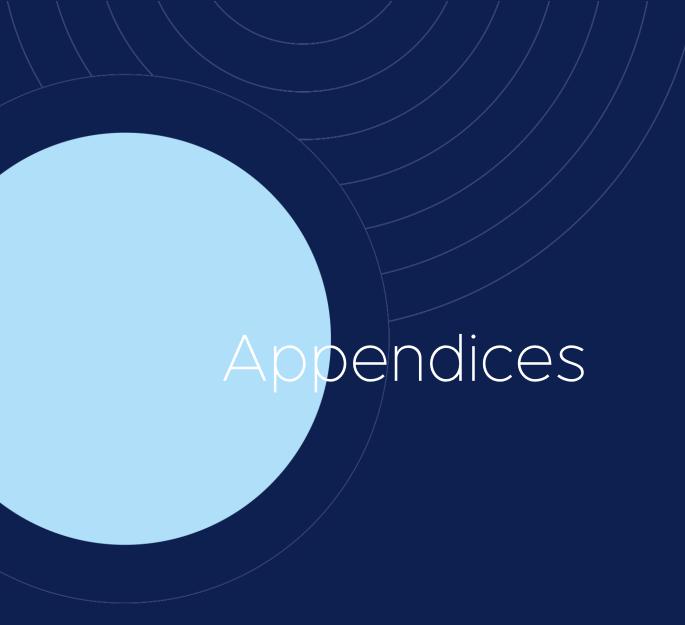

- Net gains on financial assets at fair value through profit and loss increased by 78% to \$184.7m, and total income up 8% inclusive of third party interests
- Operating expenses directly attributable to LCM of A\$13.9 million for the period ended 30 June 2023 increased by 27% compared to A\$10.9 million in FY22. We continue to expect to see an increase in operating costs as we expand, however these are expected to remain appropriate relative to the size of the portfolio under management.
- Non-operating expenses predominantly comprise SBP amortisation, one-off consultancy costs and legal costs and Fund costs attributable to LCM

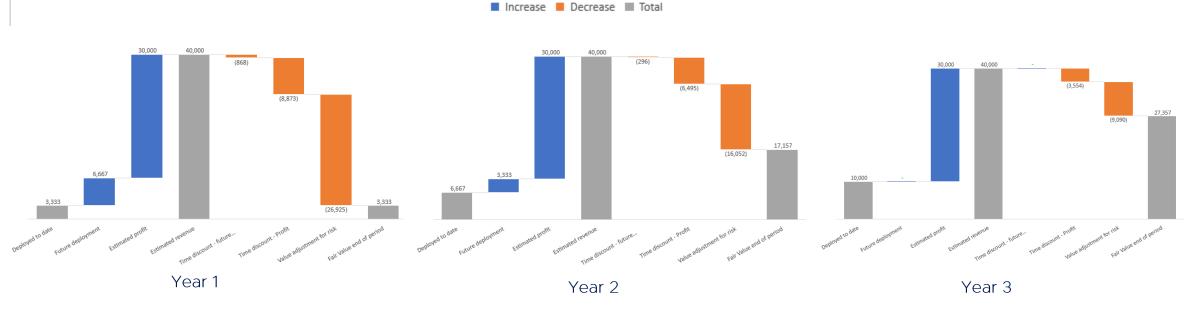
